- > waited for over an hour before anyone had the decency to

- > It was into this situation that Kay was precipitated on
- > leaving the train at Alperton station. She called me on her
- > mobile phone as she tried to work her way through the
- > crowds; her voice betrayed not just anger, but also fear.
- > The deafening noise around her almost stopped me from
- > hearing what she was saying at times.

- > She had asked a policeman - they were all standing by, of
- > course - what had happened and he told her these crowds had
- > been 'jostling' the buses, so they had had to stop
- > the buses to avoid this. Ealing Road is a major bus route,
- > an A road. How can it be allowed that it is brought to a
- > halt in this way?

- > The situation was such that the traders were hurriedly
- > closing their shops for fear of damage. You have to admit
- > that doesn't happen very often, and goes a long way to
- > telling you how badly out of control these crowds were.

- > I cannot believe that no one anticipated this. As soon as I
- > saw the cricket result, I knew what would happen. It has
- > happened before, though never to this extreme, so the
- > precedent had already been set.

- > What happened to the Dispersal Order? Why were bus services
- > suspended at great inconvenience to the residents of this
- > area? The road is full of CCTV cameras, and the buses also
- > carry them. Are the results being studied to see how this
- > happened.

- > I never thought I would see the day when the police had to
- > stand by and do nothing while a whole street became a no-go
- > area. I don't recall English cricket fans running
- > rampant round the streets when they won the Ashes back, or
- > the Rugby supporters doing this when they won the World
- > Cup. Despite the often spurious belief that all football
- > fans are hooligans, I can't recall Chelsea fans
